## **SOFT BLAST** 2023/2024



Led by the guiding principles of choice and impetus, SOFT BLAST celebrates the fluidity of stage femme while confronting stereotypes and glass ceilings prevalent in the music industry. Voices move through the space, weaving a narrative that transcends boundaries and fosters connection among performer and audience members alike.

### The Ostrobothnians

2024/2025



Finland, the world's happiest country, has also been dubbed the land of thousands of sad songs: violence, alcoholism and inequality lurk in the shadows of the Nordic welfare society.

Leevi Madetoja's (1887–1947) The Ostrobothnians ("Pohjalaisia") is often called Finland's national opera, and rightly so. It's a story about persistence, human rights, and freedom. Pohjalaisia was first performed in 1924. A century later, it reminds us of the timeless nature of stories that stir the human soul. The melodic music of the opera appeals to the emotions with its wistful undertones.

Now, The Ostrobothnians has been reinterpreted by some of Finland's leading creatives. Paavo Westerberg, known for his work in film and TV, transitions his first opera production impactfully between scenes with powerful imagery. The intriguing staging is set against the backdrop of a potato field.

## The Listeners

Using voice, rhythm, and movement the dancers explore the relation between listening and moving. In a performance that could be a concert in the sense that it invokes listening, the space and the bodies are played as instruments. The dance becomes a tool to describe the sound, and the sound becomes a tool to describe the dance. Sounds and movements create knots and entanglements that feedback off each other and that produces a situation where the skill of paying attention is practiced on all sides, on that of the performer-listener and on that of the audiencelistener. In that sense, the title does not only refer to the performers but also to the audience. The role of the performer is to notice and let notice, the skill is to listen and describe.

The Listeners was originally made for the Swedish company Cullberg in a year 2020.

## Sumua/Farewell 2024



3,2,1 (The Walk) was premiered as part of Amos Rex´s Generation 2023-exhibition in May, 2023.

"This piece was born out of an interest in exploring the mutual possibilities of dance, fashion and clothing design. Its movement is inspired by the clothing designed for the piece and its materials. A new kind of rhythm is created in the space when the restrained atmosphere of the museum meets accelerating energy that draws from fashion shows. The work is also influenced by characteristics of fashion shows, bringing them into the museum environment.

The outfits designed for the piece by Angel Emmanuel are made from recycled materials. Their textiles, weight, thickness and size add their own dimension to the dancers' movement."
